## WCFC LEARNING NETWORKS



CHILD CARE VOICE The Child Care Voice Learning Network is a collaboration of early learning providers from all settings, programs, and models in WA's mixed-delivery system who engage around issues impacting the early learning workforce.

DATA

The Data Learning Network uses data to inform early childhood system improvement and explores opportunities to align data systems. This group helps develop the State of the Children: Early Learning & Care reports.

**EQUITY** 

The Equity Learning Network has been a space to discuss a range of equity topics and explore strategies to embed equity in the WCFC Network. This network is currently restructuring, stay tuned for updates!

FAMILY VOICE The Family Voice Learning Network explores and promotes strategies to connect families with young children to resources and to elevate family and community voice in system co-design efforts.

HEALTH PROVIDER VOICE The Health Provider Voice Learning Network explores strategies to connect child and family health providers to each other and the community, to strengthen referral pathways, and remove system barriers for families.

POLICY & ADVOCACY

The Policy & Advocacy Learning Network is focused on identifying and advocating for resources and policies that improve the wellbeing of children, families, and communities.

RESOURCE NAVIGATION & ACCESS The Resource Navigation & Access Learning Network is a gathering of people and organizations who are committed to collaboratively bettering resource sharing systems in WA state.
